- Takina the new Wellington convention centre across from Te Papa
- Te Papa itself has a family type café on the ground level and Espresso café on level 4

Shop at gourmet foodie places:

- Moore Wilson, Tory Street walkable from the waterfront
- Mediterrian Warehouse, Newtown drive or take a bus
- La Bella Italia, Petone drive or take a train

Take your Alfa for a drive:

- **Wellington city tour** of lookouts, and the coast road. A map will be provided in your registration pack to do the drive when you have a gap in your weekend schedule.
- Via roads you haven't driven before, join the fun run on Saturday afternoon to the Kapiti
 Coast ending up at Southwards Museum further details on this Festa site. Directions will be provided in your registration pack.
- Historical Wellington hill climbs join the post Festa tour on Monday morning or take the
 tour in your own time when you have a gap in your weekend schedule further details on
 this Festa site. Directions will be provided in your registration pack.
- The **Wellington Zoo** drive or take a bus https://wellingtonzoo.com/
- Massey Memorial on the harbour coast road. Involves an easy walk up to the memorial and provides a great view of the harbour and city.
- Atatürk Memorial (an ANZAC memorial very moving and well worth a visit). On the
 harbour coast road and is in the hill climb tour. Involves a steady climb by foot on a pathway
 and up some steps to the memorial. Great views of the harbour entrance, south coast, and

Take a Wellington walk further afield!

- Ōtari-Wilton's Bush. The Ōtari-Wilton's Bush plant collections contain about 1,200 species, hybrids, and cultivars. The collections include plants from New Zealand's mainland and off-shore islands. Wellington Gardens | Ōtari-Wilton's Bush
- Mt Kaukau Walk —provides fantastic views of the city by foot. It is a 4 kilometre walk which takes about 3 hours for anyone wanting a workout! Recover with a coffee at Café du Parc in Khandallah Park. Mount Kaukau summit Khandallah Park loop Outdoors Wellington City Council
